

Me. Me! We are instinctively self-centered. We want to be noticed, we want to be in control, we want things to go OUR way... we think we are better than everybody else! We get defensive if someone questions us. We become argumentative because we want to be RIGHT! We get consumed with the: "me, my, I" syndrome. This is a result of pride and selfishness in our lives. "Self" always seeks to promote itself and impress others. It's all about ME. My desires, my dreams, my goals..."They hurt MY feelings" "I need MY space." "Why did this happen to me?"

Living by our pride is exhausting! It requires so much energy and the burden of how everything turns out then rests on our shoulders. This weight is too heavy and eventually we are crushed under the pressure of it all. God never intended for us to have control... in fact, the Bible tells us that He "opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble" (James 4:6).

Our response needs to be that of a humble heart. We need to let go of our pride as we seek to "do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves" (Philippians 2:3). Humility is the special attire that God wants us to wear as He says we are to clothe ourselves with humility (1 Peter 5:5). It is this special quality that gets God's attention, allows us to grow, enables us to have great relationships with others, and is the foundation for true success in our lives.

The TRUTH is... it's not about me. It is all about JESUS. Jesus says in John 14:6, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

The Beginning of Pride: Satan's downfall

Isaiah 14:13-14 (NIV) "You [Lucifer] said in your heart, 'I will ascend to the heavens; I will raise my throne above the stars of God; I will sit enthroned on the mount of assembly, on the utmost heights of Mount Zaphon. I will ascend above the tops of the clouds; I will make **myself** like the Most High."

We see in Isaiah 14 that Lucifer allowed his high position and beauty to lead him away from being content and grateful... he was deceived and thought more of himself than he should have! The same thing can easily happen to us... Paul writes a warning to us in Romans 12:3 "For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you."

PRIDE is consumed with being right... it doesn't want to apologize or admit mistakes...it ruins relationships... it doesn't respect authority... it clouds the truth of God's Word... it exalts itself!
